Dear Landowner,

We are currently planning and executing the Brightline Bulk Electric System (BES) Initiative: a multi-year New York State Electric and Gas (NYSEG) electric transmission system upgrade program that will ensure the company complies with mandatory reliability requirements from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and the North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC).

Based on recent assessments in New York State, we've determined that the Fraser and Delhi substations in your region and their corresponding transmission lines require project updates in order to meet the new reliability criteria. Because your property is located directly adjacent to a Right of Way (ROW) or substation that we will be working at or along, you are considered a "directly affected" landowner. As a "directly affected" landowner near one or more the identified area(s), we want you to have accurate information about the project. We have included a map of your land parcel and how it relates to the work we have planned. Enclosed with this letter are Project Fact sheet(s) that speak to the specifics of the work that is to be completed.

The six-phase multi-year project is anticipated to start in June 2020. As part of our dedicated outreach to our customers and neighbors, we will provide you with a landowner notification letter and project fact sheet two months prior to the beginning of activities in or around the area of your property. In the meantime, we will have the project information on display and our staff available to answer your questions **March 2nd, 2020 at 7 pm at the Delaware Academy**. If you are unable to attend, we would like to direct you to a webpage that we have set up for you to familiarize yourself with the all work that is scheduled in your surrounding area.
